### Fall behind

**To remain at the same level or standard**

ABC company has fallen behind.

### Fall down

**To fall accidentally**

I fell down and hurt my palm.

### Fall for

**To fall in love**

He fell for her and unluckily didn't married her

### Fall for

**To be tricked or deceived**

Will you fall for such a new trick?

### Fall off

**1. Fall down**

**2. Decrease or become less**

1. She fell off her stair and hurt herself.

2. The level of water has fallen off.

### Fall on

**To attack fiercely**

Who will fell on the retreating army and routed them?

### Fall out

**1. To quarrel and stop being friend**

**2. To become loose and drop**

1. Why she has fallen out over some stupid misunderstanding.

2. The water fell out from the glass.

### Fall over

**Fall to the ground**

Yesterday I slipped on the ice and fell over.

### Fall through

**To fail to be completed like some idea, plan, project, arrangement etc.**

The ceremony fell through for reasons that are not clear.

Fall apart

To disintegrate or fall to pieces like family, life, relationship, car etc.

The building is falling apart.
