### Let down

#### Disappointed someone

Sara can rely on him; he'll never let her down.

### Let down

#### Lower or deflate any bucket, plane, balloon

Stop! The mad will let down a rope so that you can come up.

### Let in

#### Allow to come into a place

Let myself in!

### Let off

1. To punishment lightly or no punishment at all.
2. To allow not to do something.
3. To fire a gun etc.

1. The teacher gave let off with only reprimand.
2. Why have they been let off office today, as them boss is sick?
3. Please let off some fireworks to celebrate the event.

### Let on

#### Reveal a secret

Will you let on about this? It must remain a secret.

### Let out

1. Release, allow to leave a place
2. Make a loud sound
3. To make a garment looser
4. Give on rent

1. She didn't let the cat out.
2. She should let out a scream.
3. This pent is too tight. I'll have to let it out.
4. My father lets out rooms to servant.
