

# Types of Adjectives



## Descriptive Adjective

Describe qualities or attributes of a noun. E.g. Beautiful flowers

## Demonstrative Adjective

Point out specific nouns. E.g. This, That, Those

## Quantitative Adjective

Indicate quantity or amount. E.g. Three, many

## Numeral Adjective

Show precise number or order of nouns. E.g. First, fifty

## Possessive Adjective

Indicate ownership or possession. E.g. My, Their

## Interrogative Adjective

Used in questions to seek information. E.g. What, Which

## Comparative Adjective

Compare two or more nouns. E.g. Bigger, Easier

## Superlative Adjective

Express the highest degree of a quality. E.g. Best, Most

## Distributive Adjective

Refer to individual nouns in a group. E.g. Each, Every

## Indefinite Adjective

General or unspecific reference. E.g. Some, Any

## Compound Adjective

Composed of two or more words to describe a noun. E.g. well-known, Blue-eyed

## Predicative Adjective

Follows a linking verb and modifies the subject. E.g. Happy, Tired
